The Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF) provides funding for eligible capital projects that increase accessibility for people with disabilities in Canadian communities and workplaces, creating more opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in community activities, programs and services, or access employment opportunities.

Government of Saskatchewan: Community Rink Affordability Grant

Fulfilling the platform promise to communities around the province, the Government of Saskatchewan announced that registration for the Community Rink Affordability Grant program (CRAG) will officially open on Monday, December 14, 2020, to provide funding for community-owned indoor skating and curling rinks. The program will provide \$2,500 a year per indoor ice surface to help cover the costs of operating rinks in villages, towns and cities. First Nations, schools, and non-profits are all eligible and encouraged to register for the grant. The grant may be used to offset the cost of rink operations, minor capital upgrades or to outfit the facility with COVID-19 related expenditures. It is expected that more than 600 ice surfaces in nearly 400 communities will be eligible to receive this support.

Jumpstart Accessibility Grants

Jumpstart Accessibility Grants are intended to support capital costs of construction and renovations related to improving physical accessibility to, and inclusivity in, recreation facilities for children with disabilities in Canadian communities. The grant offers two funding streams: *Accessibility-Enabling Grants*, which provide eligible facilities with up to \$50,000 for projects to adapt and enhance existing facilities, and *Inclusive Design Innovation Grants*, which provide between \$250,000 and \$1,000,000 for projects designed to uniquely enhance sport and recreation spaces with innovative solutions.
